



INTRODUCTION

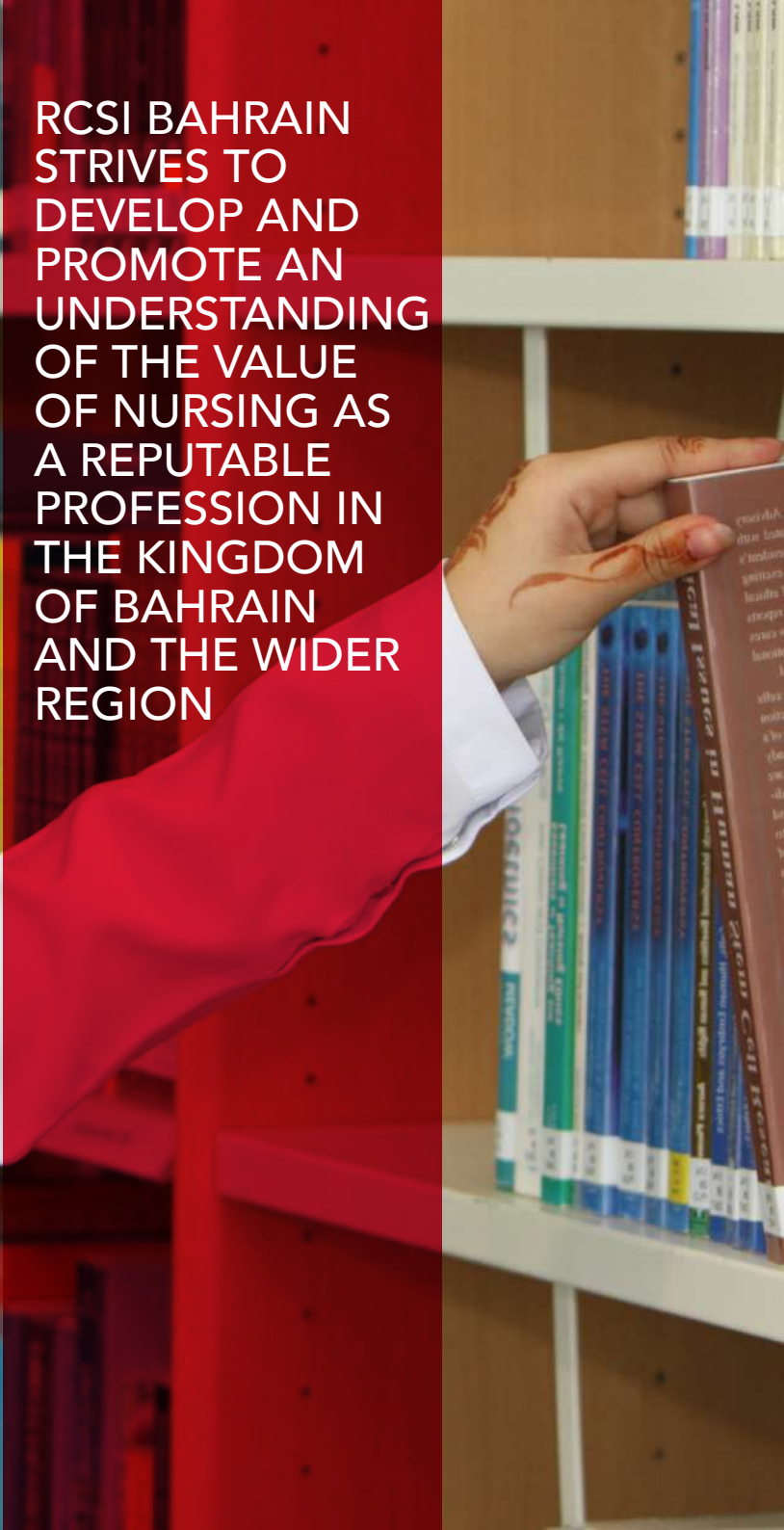
At RCSI Bahrain, we strive to develop and promote an understanding of the value of nursing as an established and respected profession in the Kingdom of Bahrain and the wider region.

BSc (Hons) NURSING PROGRAMME

OVERVIEW

The BSc (Hons) Nursing is a full-time, four-year nursing degree programme.

Graduates are empowered with the skills required to become a future leader, and to actively develop the nursing profession and the health of the community.

During the programme, students will gain experience in the nursing care of children, adults and the elderly and will spend half of their time in clinical settings such as primary healthcare, community care, psychiatric care and general and specialist hospital care.

There, they will learn the principles of holistic care, clinical competence, therapeutic communication, accountability and personal development. The curriculum also includes biomedical and social sciences knowledge applied in an integrated pattern, while the education dynamic involves the fostering of problem-solving skills, critical thinking and evidence-based approaches, all fundamental to nursing.

QUALIFICATION

Students will graduate from the School of Nursing and Midwifery with a BSc (Hons) Nursing from RCSI Bahrain and the National University of Ireland.

CURRICULUM

BSc (Hons) Nursing graduates are able to conduct a holistic assessment of patient needs, and plan their care in conjunction with other team members. They are also able to track patient progress in line with a care plan, and be fully aware of legalities around their care. RCSI Bahrain strives to produce self-aware nurses who develop their competence while practicing, and who can establish, maintain, and conclude therapeutic practice with patients, be it on an individual, group, family or community basis.

Being a nurse means being a team player, and at a more senior stage, graduates will be able to lead and delegate to other nurses, and foster teamwork in their daily practice. Most importantly, they can take responsibility to enrich lifelong personal and professional development of themselves and others.

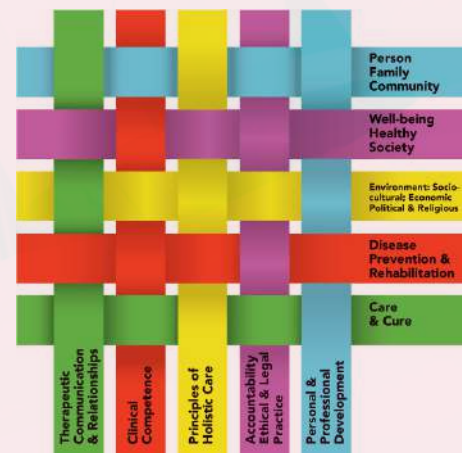
Modules of the BSc (Hons) Nursing

BSc (Hons) NURSING BRIDGING PROGRAMME

OVERVIEW

The BSc (Hons) Nursing Bridging programme is delivered over eighteen months/three semesters (part-time), and is designed for registered nurses who have already obtained a nursing Diploma.

The programme is uniquely constructed to upgrade qualifications of existing nurses to BSc (Hons) Nursing degree level and to enable career advancement. Whatever the clinical background - be it general hospital; psychiatry; community nursing - this programme provides the opportunity to enhance personal and professional development and performance.

The BSc (Hons) Nursing Bridging programme has also been delivered at Johns Hopkins Aramco Health Care in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, reflecting applicability across different countries.

QUALIFICATION

Graduates will be awarded a BSc (Hons) Nursing (Bridging) degree from RCSI Bahrain and the National University of Ireland (NUI).

BSc (Hons) Nursing (Bridging) students will be equipped with the necessary skills to be able to:

- Assess, plan, implement and evaluate health promotion strategies, taking into account the factors that determine and influence health.
- Integrate nursing theories and principles into competent nursing practice.
- Analyse research findings and evidence to improve the quality of patient care.
- Apply skills of clinical health assessment in various health care settings.
- Assess the role of the nurse and related challenges in the delivery of healthcare, in order to position themselves as a leader in the organisation.
- Practice in a professional manner within a legislative and ethical framework
